WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor in Council issued
Order-in-Council No. 193 February 1, 1982 and directed the
Commission to hold hearings on any Applications received for
a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the con-
struction or operation of a pay-television undertaking; and

WHEREAS the Commission issued a public notice
advising of the terms of reference of Order-in-Council No.
193; and

WHEREAS Selkirk Cablevision Ltd. applied for a
Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity by an
Application dated August 11, 1982; and

WHEREAS the Application was heard by the Commis-
sion in Vancouver on August 18, 1982; and

WHEREAS the Applicant commenced the operation of
a pay-television undertaking in Port McNeill, Port Hardy,
Alert Bay and Sointula, British Columbia prior to
September 11, 1980.

NOW THEREFORE the Commission orders as follows:

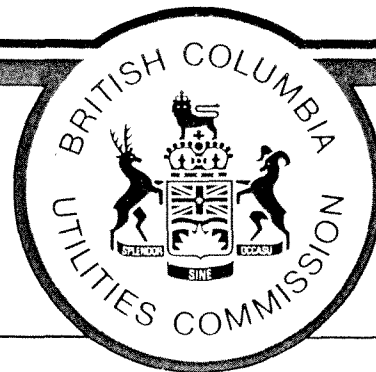
1. Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. T-16-82 issue to Selkirk Cablevision Ltd. covering the ownership and operation of a pay-television undertaking serving Port McNeill, Port Hardy, Alert Bay and Sointula, British Columbia, all as more particularly described in the Application and hearing record, subject to the following condition:
 - (a) The service offered by the undertaking must be provided at the rates and under the terms of service described in the Application and the hearing record.
2. A complaint which the Commission finds is related to a matter which may be in contravention of the guidelines for enforcement of the obscenity provisions, Criminal Code of Canada may be referred to the Attorney General for investigation and the Commission may suspend the Certificate until such matter is concluded.
3. No variation or alteration in the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity or this Order may be made without the approval of the Commission first obtained.
