Inc."; and

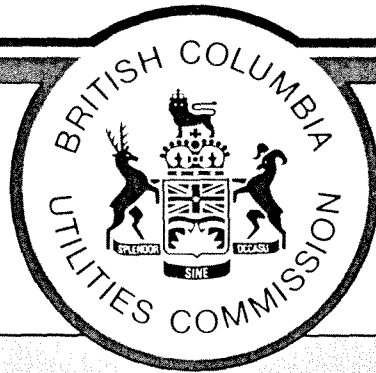
WHEREAS the Commission has reviewed the circum-
