# ORDER

### WHEREAS:

**BEFORE:** 

- A. On December 19, 1994 a Joint Application ("the Application") dated November 23, 1994, from the Cities of Vancouver and Burnaby ("the Cities"), was filed requesting that the Commission issue an Order to British Columbia Hydro and Power Authority ("B.C. Hydro") to underground, at the Utility's expense, its 230 kV Transmission Line that borders the Cities along Boundary Road; and
- B. The Commission received numerous complaints about the transmission line from residents, identified as Citizens Against Transmission Towers ("CATT"), which is a neighborhood committee comprised of citizens living adjacent to the overhead transmission lines on Boundary Road; and
- C. The CATT group held extensive discussions with B.C. Hydro about undergrounding the lines and reached no solutions satisfactory to the group; and
- D. In 1992 the City of Vancouver took the matter before the provincial government and was advised to seek a resolution through the Commission; and
- E. On January 31, 1995 the Commission advised the interested parties that it will hold a Public Inquiry, under the auspices of a single Inquiry Officer, to review the Application and issued Information Requests to B.C. Hydro and the Cities.
