**WHEREAS:**

- A. On February 17, 2004 the Commission received an application from Pengrowth Corporation for an exemption from Section 71 and Part 3 of the Utilities Commission Act ("the Act") for the purposes of the sale of power to L&E Consulting Ltd.; and
- B. Pengrowth Corporation owns and operates a diesel generator in an isolated area of North Eastern BC (LSD B-38-J/94-H-2) for the purposes of supplying power to its oil field operations; and
- C. L&E Consulting Ltd. owns and operates a camp for oil field workers near the same area; and
- D. Pengrowth Corporation and L&E Consulting Ltd. have entered a mutually acceptable agreement for the sale and delivery of power from Pengrowth's diesel generation; and
- E. Pursuant to Section 88(3) of the Act the Commission has requested and received approval from the Lieutenant Governor in Council by Order in Council No. 687, 2004 (attached as Appendix A to this Order) to issue an exemption from Section 71 and Part 3 (except Section 22) of the Act; and
- F. The Commission, pursuant to Section 99 of the Act, may reconsider, vary or rescind a decision, order, rule or regulation made by it.



On the recommendation of the undersigned, the Lieutenant Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, orders that
