# ORDER

### **WHEREAS:**

- A. On May 21, 2004, FortisBC Inc. ("FortisBC") [formerly known as Aquila Networks Canada (British Columbia) Ltd.] applied to the Commission for approval to amend its Electric Tariff, Terms and Conditions of Service, to replace the 10 percent discount given to residential customers for prompt payment with a 1.5 percent late payment charge; and
- B. FortisBC states that the proposed rate will be compliant with all applicable laws and more consistent with its other rate categories and sound public utility practice; and
- C. Recent judicial decisions suggest that the appropriateness of certain late payment arrangements may be challenged; and
- D. The impact of the change is revenue-neutral and the use of a 1.5 percent late payment charge on overdue accounts is a standard practice of other utilities under Commission jurisdiction; and
- E. Commission Order No. G-53-04 established a regulatory process to deal with the Application; and
- F. On June 11, 2004, FortisBC requested that the Commission adjust the timetable to enable it to more fully prepare employees for the anticipated customer interaction and minimize any disruptions that may result.

NOW THEREFORE the Commission orders as follows:

1. A written public hearing process will be undertaken to review the Application.
