## ORDER

## **WHEREAS:**

- A. Commission Order G-67-09 required entities subject to approved mandatory reliability standards to file mitigation plans outlining how they plan to meet compliance with standards they were not in compliance with;
- B. The Compliance Monitoring Program approved by Order G-123-09 requires that an entity file a mitigation plan for every confirmed violation to a standard requirement and that the Western Electricity Coordinating Council (WECC), as the Commission's administrator, review the mitigation plan and make a recommendation to the Commission;
- C. On December 8, 2011, WECC recommended the Commission approve the dismissal of duplicated violation records for Catalyst Paper Powell River Division for the following standards including any related mitigation plans:
  - PRC-005-1, R1 by Self-Report submitted on October 20, 2011
  - PRC-005-1, R2 by Self-Report submitted on October 20, 2011
  - PRC-005-1, R2 by Self-Certification submitted on October 20, 2011
  - PRC-008-0, R1 by Self-Certification submitted on October 20, 2011
  - PRC-008-0, R2 by Self-Certification submitted on October 20, 2011.
