ORDER

WHEREAS:

- A. Order G-123-09 approved the Compliance Monitoring Program (CMP) which provides a process for dealing with violations to Mandatory Reliability Standards (MRS) adopted by the British Columbia Utilities Commission (Commission);
- B. On July 25, 2012, the Western Electricity Coordinating Council (WECC), acting as the Commission's MRS Administrator, issued a Notice of Alleged Violation (NOAV) to British Columbia Hydro and Power Authority (BC Hydro) for Violation of Reliability Standard PRC-005-1 Requirement 2 (Violation ID BCUC201100287) beginning on November 1, 2010. The NOAV described the nature of the violation and provided an assessment of the severity of the violation;
- C. On July 25, 2012, WECC also advised BC Hydro of its rights under Section 4.2 of the CMP, pursuant to which BC Hydro has thirty days (30) to respond to the NOAV. The CMP also states if BC Hydro fails to respond within 30 days, the Commission may consider the Alleged Violation in the absence of a submission;
- D. BC Hydro did not respond within the allotted time period;
- E. The Commission has reviewed WECC's recommendation and considers confirmation of the violation is warranted.
